


What is Action Research?

- Practitioner based research
- Systematic enquiry into practice to:
 - Develop managerial skills
 - Improve the school climate and culture
 - Develop life long learning approach
- Align practice with accepted values

Why do action research?

Living out values

 be clear about what you do and why when setting strategic goals

Empowering managers

 to bring about improvement in own practice and, subsequently, whole school

Encourages

- collaboration and
- participatory management

If action research becomes a norm with management and subsequently all teachers and learners in the school, then the school can transform itself into a centre of excellence.

Teacher portfolios of action research will be a good indication of growth and development and can even be used as part of a performance appraisal



Action research increases enthusiasm among teachers – when you are involved in your work and in control, it becomes much more exciting and enjoyable.

Action research promotes openness and transparency as people come to see that "mistakes" are valuable learning tools.




How to carry out an AR study

- Spiral process which alternates between action and critical reflection
- Continuously refining managerial practice in light of understanding gained in earlier cycles
- Participative process
- Emergent process, takes shape as progresses

Basic steps in action research

- 1. Review current practice
- 2. Identify aspect that needs improvement
- 3. Imagine a way to improve
- 4. Try it out
- 5. Evaluate
- 6. Modify in light of evaluation
- 7. Monitor
- 8. Review
- 9. Evaluate





Examples of current projects
